### Upcoming Symposium

#### Entwined Health System Histories: New Zealand and Britain Since 1938

Tuesday 24 October 2017, Penthouse, New Zealand House, 80 Haymarket, London SW1Y 4TQ

As part of a larger Wellcome funded project on Health Systems in History, historians at the LSHTM and the University of Auckland are working on a study which aims to examine parallels and interlinkages between the UK and NZ health systems. In particular, we are interested in the flow of ideas between NZ and the UK, from the Beveridge era, to the purchaser/provider split, and on to the 2000s. In order to formally launch this arm of the Health Systems project we are holding a symposium at New Zealand House in the afternoon and evening of 24 October which is sponsored by NZ/UK Link. The programme will consist of a number of academic papers exploring connections in health policy and systems between the two countries over the study period and will be followed by an oral history component where we will be asking those with first-hand experience of working in both systems to share their experiences.
